




No. 1 / Hang your art horizontally

hang your art like a pro

The trick to a truly professional-looking home gallery is all on the line: use removable blue painter's tape as your guide – whether horizontal, vertical or on a grid.

To save time and protect your walls from misplaced holes, create paper cutouts in the sizes and shapes of your frames, then tape them up to decide where each should go.

And don't forget: when creating a unique wall art display, frame risers offer depth and versatility.
